You will join an internationally networked team, pursuing research on the border between ICT and humanities studies. Your research will be focused on server-side software components (web services and web applications) to be developed as part of the institute's digital research infrastructure activities and will also have to be documented through academic publications.

The ideal candidate has a thorough knowledge of

- web technologies (HTML, CSS, Javascript),
- scripting languages (mainly Python/django),

as well as familiarity with

- Javascript frameworks (AngularJS, React, NodeJS),
- XML technologies (XSLT, XPath, XQuery),
- information visualisation techniques (Geodata, Graph/Network Visualisation),
- Database management and development (SQL, XML-DBs, NoSQL),
- Semantic Web technologies (RDF, SKOS, LOD),
- content management systems (Drupal, WordPress).

We invite applicants with

- experience in working in complex systems with a variety of technologies,
- a high degree of creativity and a willingness to learn new emerging technologies,
- hands-on experience in designing and implementing complex web applications,
- excellent communication skills and
- willingness to travel.

An interest in humanities studies as well as experiences with particular humanities disciplines and/or the paradigms of digital humanities is regarded as an asset.

The employment will start in May 2018 and initially run until 30 April 2019. The contract can be extended. In accordance with the collective agreement for employees of the Austrian Academy of Sciences, the initial monthly gross salary is € 2.715 (paid out 14 times a year, overpay possible).
