I am a trained Japanologist (B.A. 2012; M.A. 2015), specializing on the dynamics between Buddhism and Shintō with an emphasis on the emancipation of Shintō as an independent tradition in early modern Japan. Since 2017, I am a Research Fellow at the Austrian Academy of Sciences' Institute for the Cultural and Intellectual History. I am regularly coordinating courses at the Department of Japanese Studies of the University of Vienna. In my doctoral research, I apply the theory of Domain Shinto examining Mito domain in the late seventeenth century. I work on manuscripts from that era using skills in early modern Japanese language and paleography to present a case study of a village in Mito. Previously, I explored the development of a state cult and the imperial family in the late nineteenth century via the restoration of imperial tombs. My most recent publications include the co-edited (with Stefan Köck and Bernhard Scheid) *Religion, Power and the Rise of Shinto in Early Modern Japan* at Bloomsbury (Shinto Studies Series) published in 2021.
