I am interested in the interaction of Jaina philosophers with other traditions of Indian thought. My main research focus lies on the history of the epistemological model that the Jainas provide for this interaction (→ *anekāntavāda*). I further study distinct textual references to other philosophical schools in Jaina Sanskrit works and collect material on the reception of the works of the Digambara Vidyānandin.
