This workshop will be organised within the 'Guiding Travelers' initiative and in collaboration with the 'Byzantijnse Studies Nederland', the Dutch committee of the 'Association Internationale des Etudes Byzantines (AIEB)'. Three guests are invited, who will address the topic in 30-minute papers:

Questions raised concern: institutional issues; the agency of people and objects; the role of geography in physically established connections; the spread of information and technological change; and how these aspects evolved between ca. the 6th and 20th century on the Eurasian continent.
