## **CANAAN IN TRANSITION, 1200–1000 B.C.: FORCED MIGRATION, OPPORTUNISM, AND RESILIENCES**

By the end of the 12 cent. B.C., the Egyptian New Kingdom Empire had withdrawn militarily from the southern Levant. This followed decades during which warfare brought destruction to many urban centers and new groups settled in the region. These circumstances contributed to a marked decline in the total number of settled sites and their density, but also to the emergence of smaller settlements in the highlands, and changes among extant urban centers. In this paper, I seek to explore the role that forced migration played in the mostly internal relocation and resettlement of communities in the wake of the dissolution of Egyptian empire during the twelfth and eleventh centuries B.C.
