How did universal religions shape the construction of particular communities and identities?

The SFB »Visions of Community: Comparative Approaches to Ethnicity, Region and Empire in Christianity, Islam and Buddhism (400-1600 CE)« (VISCOM) proposes a comparative approach to explore the interaction between religious and political visions of community. All three religions were not only used to legitimize imperial rule, but they also encouraged other forms of community, be they local, regional, civic, or ethnic. However, in each case, the impact worked in different ways. In order to study these differences, VIS-COM attempts to bridge the gaps between history and social anthropology, between European and Asian studies, between religious and political history, and, more generally, between research on discourse and on practi-

This Opening Conference, Comparative Methods in the Historical and Social Sciences represents a first step by reflecting on the process of comparative research and modelbuilding itself. The scholars brought together in Vienna will bring into focus ethnic, religious, political and civic communities, as well as their interdependence. By comparing the different methods employed in the study of different types of community, they will explore the chances and pitfalls of such an interdisciplinary dialogue. Thus, the conference's aim is to open up new methodological perspectives, while at the same time stimulating research in the specific fields and raising new questions for VISCOM to study.
