

Diese Tagung eröffnet ein neues Forschungsfeld: handschriftlich erhaltene Gebetbücher aus byzantinischer Zeit (bis 1650) und insbesondere die darin enthaltenen situationspezifischen Gebete als Quelle zur Alltags- und Sozialgeschichte. Diese sollen in einer an der Österreichischen Akademie der Wissenschaften angesiedelten Datenbank erfasst und zugänglich gemacht werden. Ziel der zweitägigen Begegnung ist der Austausch mit thematisch und methodisch analog konzipierten Datenbankprojekten zur Handschriftenkunde, Bibelwissenschaft, Liturgiewissenschaft und zu christlichen Gebrauchstexten.

This conference opens up a new research field: Byzantine prayer book manuscripts (until 1650) and the 'small' prayers they contain for specific situations. These constitute a valuable source for social history and daily life and will be made accessible in a database at the Austrian Academy of Sciences. This two-day meeting aims to foster a conversation among thematically and methodologically similar database projects in manuscript studies, biblical studies, liturgical studies, and the study of texts for common use by Christians.
