### **Shifting Borders and New Conceptions of Territoriality**

Online Hybrid

Building on the arguments developed in *The Shifting Border: Legal Cartographies of Migration and Mobility* (shortlisted for the 2022 C.B. Macpherson Prize), Prof. Shachar's keynote lecture will explore three themes: the rise of the shifting border paradigm in a world of heightened migration pressures; the renewed significance of states' regulatory authority to permit or halt movement as illustrated by the pandemic; and the contrast between the regional response to the Ukrainian refugee crisis and the breakdown of solidarity in previous refugee crises. Together, these themes elucidate the importance of new conceptions of territoriality and the urgent need to rethink the bonds of political membership in an age of mass displacement, due to warfare today or climate-induced migration tomorrow.

### **Walls, Bridges and Tolls: Exploring The Global Structure of State Border Control**

This keynote talk illustrates findings of the MPC's Global Mobilities Project, which aims to analyze data on the global structure of population movements and the factors shaping them. In particular, it will focus on two primary gate-keeping capacities of contemporary states: visas

and cross-border infrastructures. As states rarely opt for total closure or total opening of their borders, rather seeking to filter flows, visas and border infrastructures (like roads and check-points) are key legal and material tools used to manage permeability to incoming outsiders. Empirically the talk will build on the Global Visa Cost Dataset and the Global Border Permeability Dataset (Recchi, Deutschmann, Gabrielli and Kholmatova, 2021; Deutschmann, Gabrielli and Recchi, forthcoming).

*Ettore Recchi is professor of Sociology at Sciences Po Paris as well as visiting fellow of the Migration Policy Centre (MPC) of the EUI (Florence) and the Institut Convergences Migrations (Paris). A methodologically versatile scholar, he has published more than 120 journal articles, book chapters, edited volumes and monographs. His papers feature in journals of sociology (e.g., *European Sociological Review*), political science (e.g., *West European Politics*), European studies (e.g., *Journal of Common Market Studies*), migration studies (e.g., *International Migration Review*), geography (e.g., *Political Geography*), global studies (e.g., *Global Networks*), demography (e.g., *Demographic Research*) and data science (e.g., *EPJ Data Science*). He was awarded the 2020 prize of the American Sociological Association for best international paper in the *Global and Transnational Section*. His latest book is *Everyday Europe: Social**

*Transnationalism in an Unsettled Continent* (Policy Press, 2019), a co-authored work on European integration through geographical and virtual mobilities. He has directed several national and international projects on free movement in Europe, transnationalism, migration, and the impact of Covid-19 on social life and mobility.

**A New Agenda For Migration Research**

In his keynote, Hein de Haas, will outline a new agenda for migration research and the need for a new, scientific vision of migration as an intrinsic part - rather than cause of consequence - of broader social transformation processes. Would that work? When would my keynote exactly be?

*Hein de Haas is a sociologist and geographer who has taught and worked in the Netherlands, Morocco and the United Kingdom. He is currently Professor of Sociology at the University of Amsterdam (UvA). Between 2006 and 2015, he was a founding member and co-director of the International Migration Institute (IMI) at the University of Oxford. From 2017, he has been directing IMI from its current home at UvA. He is also Professor of Migration and Development at the University of Maastricht.*

*In his work, De Haas has advanced a long-term view of migration as an integral part of global change and development. De Haas is lead author of *The Age of Migration: International Population Movements in the Modern World*, a leading text book in the field of migration studies. He also maintains a blog on migration-related topics.*

**Feminist, postcolonial, decolonial: articulations with migration theory and practice**

Decolonisation has become a buzzword across the academy, in institutions, disciplines and in research topics. Migration studies too has had some debates on decolonisation but, the relationship between postcolonial and decolonial thought and the differential demands they place on migration theory and practice has received little attention. This presentation will focus on my experiences of researching migration through a feminist lens and on postcolonial and decolonial challenges for both migration theory and practice.



*Parvati Raghuram is Professor in Geography and Migration at the Open University. She has published widely on retheorising migration of international students and skilled migrants, particularly women in the IT sector and medicine.*

*She won the prestigious Murchison Award from the RGS-IBG in 2016, making her the first non-white woman to win this in its' 120 year history. She has written for policy audiences having co-authored research papers for a number of think-tanks and UN organisations.*

*She co-edits the journal *South Asian Diaspora*, *Geographical Journal* and the *Palgrave Pivot* series *Mobility and Politics*. She is executive board member of *IMISCOE* (European migration research group) and is currently chairing the *BLM* group there. At the *OU* she has been an active member of the *BME Network* steering group and is co-chairing the *Decolonising the curriculum* group*
