You will join an internationally networked team, pursuing research on the border between information and communication technology and humanities studies.

Your responsibilities will comprise

- ontology modelling,
- automated conversion of datasets and
- quality assessment and curation of data.

Ideally, the candidate has

- a university degree in digital humanities, history with specialisation on historical computing or computer science with a proven interest in humanities topics,
- ample experience in Semantic Web technologies & resources (RDF, OWL, SPARQL, LOD),
- experience in working in complex systems with a variety of technologies,
- experience in automatic data processing,
- fluency in at least one scripting language (e.g. Python, R),
- experience with processing Humanities data (e.g. incomplete, ambiguous and fuzzy data),
- strong analytical skills and
- a high degree of creativity and a willingness to engage in new emerging technologies.
