Your tasks & profile:

- A master’s degree in communication science or a closely related field is required.
- Applicants should have a good understanding of the Austrian media system and particularly the Austrian political communication environment and a dissertation project in this field is to be developed and/or undertaken. They have methodological knowledge, and are capable of quantitative and qualitative analysis.
- The position entails research under supervision as well as international presentations and publications in international scientific journals.

Further required skills are:

- fluency in German and English, both written and spoken
- good communication skills
- a willingness to cooperate and to work team oriented

We offer a 75% employment contract (30 hours per week), limited until to 3 years, for an annual gross salary of € 31.326,40, according to the salary scheme of the Austrian Academy of Sciences. Depending on qualification and experience, the salary can be negotiated. The position may be extended if third-party funding is obtained.
