The research group investigates trends and differentials in morbidity and mortality. In particular, we want to better understand the causal mechanisms that enable some people to live longer and healthier than others. Our analyses are based on different data sources including aggregated data, survey data and self-collected data. Another focus is on methodological developments for the estimation of life expectancy and health expectancy, especially for populations and subpopulations with incomplete or missing data.

Your tasks:

The successful candidates will carry out research for their dissertation project and thus make a visible contribution to the research output of the institute. They will contribute to studies and projects of the research group and to publications in high-ranking refereed journals. They will also present their works and results internationally at conferences. In all these contexts, the PhD students will be actively supported by their supervisors and the institute management.
